

AHTF as an independent Foundation relies solely on its generous supporters for revenue. The Foundation continues to be fiscally responsible in controlling its operating costs, maximizing allocations for grants funding hand therapy research and educational scholarships. The AHTF list of individual donors https://www.ahtf.org/donations/list-of-donors/ as well as our corporate and professional partners https://www.ahtf.org/donations/corporate-partners/ are updated on a quarterly basis.

2023 income sources included generous monthly donors and individual donors, as well as support from upper extremity associations, organizations, corporate partnerships, and event underwriting. Projected 2023 income is approximately \$98,000.

2023 non-grant and scholarship-related expenses include fees for our part-time executive director, accounting services, website maintenance, state registration compliance with charitable giving regulations, legal services, and the fundraising events. Projected 2023 expenses are approximately \$65,000.

2023 restricted fund expenses included almost \$71,000 in Grants and Awards and underwriting of the 2023 ASHT Annual Meeting Scientific Session.


